The Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) is a USDA program administered through the Indiana State Department of Health

and distributed through Tri-State Food Bank. It serves to supplement the diets of adults age 60 and over who meet set income requirements.

Participants receive a monthly box of food chosen to address common nutritional deficiencies in older adults, such as vitamins A and C, calcium, and iron.

Boxes may include:

- A 2lb block of cheese
- Canned meats
- Vegetables
- Fruits and Juices

- Powdered, evaporated, or shelf stable milk
- Other high protein items
- Grains / Pasta / cereals
- Recipes and nutrition information

You may be eligible to receive a monthly box of nutritious USDA foods if you meet all of the

- Reside in the county of distribution
- Are 60 years of age or older
